## **USBR to close Delta Cross Channel Gates at times through spring**

The Bureau of Reclamation has announced that the Delta Cross Channel Gates will be closed to allow winter-run Chinook salmon to migrate to the ocean. Closures will occur intermittently through next spring. During closures, boat traffic will be unable to pass through the Delta Cross Channel Gates, so boaters should plan alternate travel routes.
