



Project Description: The Department of Water Resources, in coordination with Reclamation District 341, constructed 6,100 linear feet of habitat setback levee to increase levee stability and provide waterside habitat restoration along Mayberry Slough on Sherman Island. This project was initiated in 2004 and was completed in 2009.

Type of Project: Tidal Marsh, Shaded Aquatic Riverine, and Upland Habitats

Restoration Targets:

192 acres emergent wetlands

115 acres seasonally flooded wetlands

Location: Sherman Island (Please see adjacent map)

Landowner: Reclamation District 341 (Sherman Island) and DWR


Funding: Planning, Design, and Construction - Proposition 84 & GF
