City of Lakewood – \$1 million for the West San Gabriel River Park.

City of Long Beach - \$1 million for the South of Willows Street Habitat Restoration

San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy - \$2 million for the South El Monte Whittier Narrows Gateway acquisition

Los Angeles River South \$5 million

City of Long Beach - \$999,781 for the Cesar Chavez Park Wetlands

City of Maywood - \$2 million for the Maywood Riverfront Park

City of South Gate - \$80,000 for the entry to the Hollydale Regional Park

City of Lynwood - \$152,000 for the Nature Park

San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy - \$1,768,219 for supplemental grants

Los Angeles River North \$10 million

City of Pasadena - \$1,078,000 for the Arroyo Seco Restoration
