WHERE:

Wallace Weir in the Yolo Bypass, about four miles northeast of Woodland (roughly 45-minute drive from Sacramento)

Directions from Sacramento: Take I-5 North. Take Exit 536 for County Road 102 (just before Woodland). Turn right onto County Road 102 and continue north for 4.1 miles. Turn right onto County Road 17 and continue 2.5 miles east up onto the levee. Turn right onto the levee and continue south for 1.5 miles until you reach the Wallace Weir.
