


REQUIREMENTS CCHE PRIORITIES

- Contributions by ethnic and other communities to CA culture
- Significant changes to daily life in CA
- Illustration of CA economic strength
- Factors contributing t o national defense
- Geologic and oceanographic history

- CA living cultural heritage and folk life
- Geologic and oceanographic history
- History, archeology and culture of CA Native Americans
- CA Stories and communities absent or unrepresented

REQUIREMENTS-MATCH

- at least 20% of the requested grant amount
- cash contributions and/or in-kind contributions
- Match to be spent as same time as grant funds
 - Exception: can use project design costs up from up to one year before grant submission deadline
- Must be secured or committed at time of application



- Supporting Documentation (program)






