



Information regarding public participation in the March 19, 2025, California Water Commission meeting

The California Water Commission will utilize an in-person format for its March 19, 2025, meeting. The Commission will retain remote public participation similar to its previous online meeting format until it moves to Item 10. This hybrid platform allows the public to participate in-person or remotely via Zoom or phone. Public comments made in person will precede public comments from remote participants. For those wishing to make an in-person comment, comment cards will be available at the meeting to establish a comment queue.

Following Agenda Item 9, the Commission will break for lunch and resume the meeting with a tour of the Lookout Slough Tidal Habitat Restoration and Flood Improvement Project in Dixon, Calif. There will not be a remote option for this tour, and it will not be recorded.

In Person

Remote via Zoom or phone

The Commission will provide two options for remote public participation, through Zoom webinar technology and a call-in number. Please see below for instructions on how to participate. Please note that the Commission will still be setting a three-minute time limit on verbal comments, however, the amount of time could change at the Chair's discretion.

During the meeting, if you wish to speak on an agenda item, you must utilize Zoom's "raise hand" feature. The "raise hand" button can be found on the Zoom webinar window (for more information, please visit [Zoom's Help Page](#)). The Chair will announce at the beginning of each item that those interested in commenting should raise their hands. Please note, when commenters speak they will be "voice-only" as video cameras will not be enabled.

If you wish to speak on an item, please dial *9 at the beginning of the item to "raise your hand" to show you wish to speak. Your phone number will not be visible to others. When it is your turn to speak, the host will call out the last three digits of your phone number. When you start your comment, please state your first and last name for the record. Please note that there may be a slight delay between the webinar and the phone audio, so it is best if you mute the webinar if you are calling in to testify by phone.

Comment process for California Native American Tribal Leadership

Elected Tribal leaders and formally designated representatives who want to comment on any agenda items, in-person or via Zoom, will have an opportunity during agenda item 4 to identify themselves and the item(s) on which they wish to comment. *Tribal leaders will not give comment at this time. They will be invited to comment during the agenda item on which they have comments.*

As requested by Tribal leaders during agenda item 4, Tribal leaders and designated representatives will be invited to provide their comments on subsequent agenda items before the Commission takes public comment. Elected Tribal leaders will be invited to speak first, then the invitation will be extended to formally designated Tribal representatives. Unless otherwise requested, Tribal comment time limits will default to the standard three minutes. Once Tribal comment is complete, the Commission will call for public comment. Tribal citizens may join the public comment queue. This process is guided by the Commission's [California Native American Tribal Leadership Comment Policy](#).

General guidelines and tips for those who wish to participate in the Zoom webinar

- Remote meetings often lack the same visual and social cues available during public, in-person meetings. Please be respectful and patient so all interested commenters can be fairly heard.
- Call into the meeting a few minutes before the scheduled start to ensure you can resolve any technical issues. You will initially be in a virtual waiting room and will remain there until the start of the meeting.
- You will be muted until it is your turn to speak. While muted, you will be able to hear the Commission meeting and can continue watching via the remote meeting service if you have connected from a computer or mobile device.
- Even if you only wish to comment on one item, the Commission encourages you to participate in the entire meeting via the Zoom webinar rather than the webcast. There could be brief delays associated with the normal webcast, and it may not be synchronized with the interactive Zoom webinar.
- Regardless of whether you participate via phone, computer, tablet, or mobile device, please participate from a quiet environment so that the Commission can hear you when you are called to speak. If you are using the internet to connect to the meeting, try to ensure you have a good connection or strong signal.
- It is important to avoid creating acoustic feedback. If there are other devices near you that are tuned into the meeting, please make sure that the speaker volume of those devices is turned off when it is your turn to participate.
- The Commission Chair will maintain order as is customary in public meetings, and individuals who are disruptive may be removed from the remote meeting service or have their connection muted.
