The Disadvantaged Community and Tribal Involvement (DACTI) Program in the Bay Area is being carried out with the Association of Bay Area Governments and the San Francisco Estuary Partnership. Tribal engagement and a Tribal needs assessment is being coordinated by the California Indian Environmental Alliance (CIEA) to ensure the involvement of local Tribes. CIEA has engaged five Tribal Program Partners.

The San Francisco Bay Area region's governing body is the Coordinating Committee, which consists of 12 representatives, 2 from each of the Functional Areas: water supply/water quality, wastewater/recycled water, flood protection/stormwater management, and watershed management/habitat protection/restoration. The region also operates through a subregional approach, consisting of the North Bay, East Bay, South Bay, and West Bay. Through the engagement work of the DACTI Program, the California Indian Environmental Alliance has partnered with five Tribal Program Partners, including the Amah Mutsun Tribal Band, Association of Ramaytush, Him-R^n, Indian People Organizing for Change, and the Muwekma Ohlone.
