This letter is in response to your November 7, 2017 letter that provides your assessment of the hairline cracks that have been observed in some of the Flood Control Outlet concrete chute slabs, part of the Feather River Project, FERC No. 2100.

We have reviewed the letter and technical memorandum. We concur with your assessment that the current condition of the hairline cracking does not warrant repair at this time. We understand that you will continue to monitor and evaluate the hairline cracks throughout the 2017 flood season and the 2018 construction season. We also understand that you will be evaluating a number of construction measures this winter that might be implemented next construction season that might reduce the likelihood of hairline cracking.

Please incorporate the proposed monitoring of the hairline cracks into the Interim Dam Safety Surveillance and Monitoring Plan (DSSMP) for the 2017 – 2018 flood season that is to be submitted to our office shortly.
